

PRESENT SIMPLE

We use the Present Simple for:

-habits and routines:

ex. I **go** to the bowling club every Friday.

The bowling coach **doesn't work** here in the summer.

-facts:

ex. You **become** adult when you are eighteen.

Do British people **have** ID cards?

-generalizations:

ex. Lots of young people **are** sports fans.

Teenagers often **argue** with adults.

STATE VERBS (seem, like, feel, etc) are usually in the Present Simple.

ex. You **seem** interested in photography.

Do you **prefer** colour or black and white?

ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY (occasionally, often, never, always, etc) with Present Simple show how often things happen. We put them:

-before a main verb:

ex. He **occasionally** goes to pop concerts.

-after to be

ex. She is **often** at home on Sundays evenings.

-**between auxiliary** (can, do, have,) and main verbs:

ex. We don't **usually** go to away games.

You can **always** get a bad mark in the school.
